## Use of the Cynnabar Baronial Trailer.

The Baronial Trailer was purchased specifically to store and move the Baronial List Field Equipment.

The List Field is defined as the stiles, rails, wedges and other parts and tools needed to erect a list enclosure.

In future the Baronial Trailer will be used only for storage of the Baronial List Field, for transport of that same List Field Equipment and then only to those events where the List Field is needed.

This does not except the transport of other items of Baronial Equipment that will pack safely with the List Field. This may include related equipment such as the padded list flooring, the Thrones, Banners, Poles or Stands for displaying them, The Stone of Cynnabar, and other items for creation of the Baronial Presence.

This Proposal, if accepted, shall become an item on the list of the Baronial Financial Policies and may be amended as specified therein.

Who is responsible for the Maintenance and Safety Checks on the trailer? Is this a job for the Exchequer or the Quartermaster? Should we create a Maintenance Policy for the Trailer?

<u>Suggestion: Have an annual inspection in addition to a Pre-use Checklist. A trailer that sits can develop flat tires or other issues.</u>

DO we have a spare tire? NO. Get one.
